IMPORTANT: Only for registrations in Capital Federal, San Miguel. The secondary and tertiary degrees issued in the Province of Buenos Aires or in the interior of the country must be legalized by the Ministry of the Interior, Public Works and Housing. In order to simplify the procedure, the following educational degrees no longer need to be legalized at the Ministry of the Interior, Public Works and Housing:

> Secondary or tertiary degree from 2010 onwards.

>University degree from 2012 onwards (refer to the University who issued the document, which will send it to Dirección Nacional de Gestión Universitaria).
